Some Household Goods and Personal Effects are Classified as

<u>Dangerous Goods</u>

These commodities cannot be accepted for transport...

There are however, some exceptions to the act. Please discuss your requirements with our representative.

The following items are listed as:-

DANGEROUS GOODS!

Division A

Toxins and Poisons; eg. Pesticides, Weed Killer, Polishes and Arsenic.

Division B

Flammable Gases; eg. Oxygen, Acetylene, Chlorine Gas and Methane.

<u>Division C</u> (see exceptions)

Firearms; eg. Military Weapons, Fully Automatic Weapons and Hand Guns.

Division D

Flammable Liquids; eg. Petrol, Kerosine, Paints, Varnish, Turpentine, Methylated Spirits, Pure Alcohol, Photographic Developer and Oils.

Division E

Radioactive Materials.

Division F

Corrosives; eg. Oxides, Mercury and Caustic.

Division G

Explosives; eg. Ammunition, Flares, Fireworks and Black Powder.

Division H (see exceptions)

Miscellaneous; eg. Scuba Tanks, Gas Cylinders, Aerosol Cans,

Matches, Butane Lighters, Irritants, Life Rafts, Pressurised Vessels and Explosive Devices.

EXCEPTIONS

- 1. a Hunting and sporting rifles (including ex-military, non-automatic).
 - b Hand guns, where copy of current registration is produced.
 - c Air rifles.
 - d Replicas (non firing).

Note; Weapons falling into division 1a & 1b above, will only be accepted, where firing mechanisms have been dismantled and removed. Weapons must not contain live ammunition.

2. a Scuba tanks may be accepted, providing they are completely empty and valves are either in the full open position or removed entirely.
